SCHOOL BOARD

SCHOOL BOARD – The School Board is declared a body corporate. In its corporate capacity, it is vested with all the powers and charged with all the duties, obligations, and responsibilities upon school boards by law. It may sue, be sued, contract, be contracted with, and in accordance with the provisions of this title, purchase, take, hold, lease, and convey school property both real and personal. The School Board has the following powers and duties: 1 – to make rules for the governance of the schools within its jurisdiction; 2 – to determine the curriculum, methods of teaching, methods of administration and governance, and the length of the school term; 3 – to employ and dismiss teachers upon the recommendation of the superintendent; 4 – to suspend or expel pupils when necessary; 5 – to establish such schools as are necessary in the judgment of the Board to so constitute a complete and efficient system; 6 – to control and manage funds made available to the Board for the purpose of conducting free public schools; 7 – examine all claims for payment and authorize payment; and 8 – to submit annually to City Council a budget request.

The Board consists of five members serving **three-year** terms appointed by City Council. **School Board members can serve a maximum of three 3-year consecutive terms.**

This board, in collaboration with the City Manager and Superintendent of Schools or their designees, shall consider, investigate, make findings, reports and recommendations regarding any special matter coming within the scope of its work. It shall be the responsibility of the Board to study, investigate, and develop recommendations for the care, preservation, pruning, planting, replanting, removal or disposition of trees and shrubs in the parks, along streets and in other publicly owned areas.

It exists to promote maximum independence for persons age 60 and older by providing services that will assist older persons to live independently in their own homes. The Agency’s tasks include advocacy, planning, and coordination of services for older persons. It serves the Counties of Franklin, Henry, Patrick, and Pittsylvania, and the Cities of Danville and Martinsville. The Board consists of twelve members serving **three-year** terms; two are appointed by City Council. According to SAAA bylaws, a member may serve **two consecutive three-year** terms. Among the responsibilities of the Board are the following: 1 – developing an area plan for aging services; 2 – identifying the needs of the elderly in the community; 3 – establishing long-range goals for meeting the needs of the elderly; 4 – formulating short-range objectives for programs to be conducted in the community; 5 – approving overall plans for carrying out the objectives; and 6 – hiring and firing the Executive Director. The Board meets on the last Monday of each month at 1:00 P. M. The Board usually meets six to eight times per year.

TERMS: Members serve three year terms. A member may serve two consecutive three-year terms.

It serves the Counties of Franklin, Henry, Patrick, and Pittsylvania, and the Cities of Danville and Martinsville. The Board consists of a maximum of fifteen members serving **three-year** terms; two members are appointed by City Council. According to West Piedmont bylaws, no less than thirty percent (30%) of the Disabilities Services Board shall be represented by individuals or family members of individuals with physical, visual, or hearing disabilities. Among the responsibilities of the Board are the following: 1 – Conducts a Needs Assessment and updates biennially; 2 – Administers the Rehabilitative Services Incentive Funds (RSIF); 3 – Advises local and state government; 4 – Informs and educates the community; 5 – Meets at least quarterly. The Board meets quarterly with the location rotating from Patrick County, Danville, Martinsville, to Franklin County.

WEST PIEDMONT PLANNING DISTRICT BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS – The Commission was created in 1969 pursuant to the Virginia Area Development Act and is a confederation of seven local governments established to plan for the orderly and efficient physical, social, and economic development of the region. The region encompasses the Cities of Martinsville and Danville, Town of Rocky Mount, and Counties of Henry, Franklin, Patrick, and Pittsylvania. The responsibilities of the Board include the development of an Annual Work Program to guide its staff in a wide range of activities including comprehensive planning, technical assistance, grant seeking, and regional coordination efforts. Other types of decisions made by the Board include establishment of regional priorities for the Virginia Community Development Block Grant Program and review and comment on requests for Federal funds made for projects within Planning District 12 through the Virginia Intergovernmental Review Process. The Board’s bylaws state that each governmental subdivision within the planning district shall appoint three members as follows: two members of the governing body and one non-elected resident qualified voter. The Board meets on the fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 P. M. There are no term limits for this board.

The Commission also serves as the West Piedmont Economic Development District Board. The Commission received designation from the U. S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development, as an Economic Development District in 1992. As an EDD, the District develops a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy annually. The Commission staff develops applications for projects such as industrial parks, incubators, and utility lines. Finally, the Commission also serves as a Rural Transportation Organization (RTPO) in conjunction with VDOT, conducting various transportation planning-related activities.

TERMS: Terms of office of members who are also member of governing bodies shall be coincident with their elected terms of office or such shorter term as their governing body shall determine. The citizen member shall serve for three years and may be reappointed.
